What is a battery energy storage system?

A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) is a sophisticated setup that stores surplus electricity in rechargeable batteries, usually lithium-ion, and supplies it back to the grid or users when required. BESS mitigate issues such as peak loads, frequency stabilization, and excess renewable energy ([waste.energy.gov](http://waste.energy.gov)).

What is battery capacity?

Battery capacity is the amount of energy a battery can store, typically measured in ampere-hours (Ah) or watt-hours (Wh). Ampere-hours indicate the total charge a battery can deliver at a specific current over time, while watt-hours provide insight into the energy stored, factoring in voltage.
